Staffing	Patient care focused – operations and clinical	July-June	Every third weekend, eight-hour shift, focused on clinical services on med / surg floors. Continuity clinic	Direct patient care at the regional center of infectious diseases (RCID)	August - June	½ day per week, except during elective months. One month immersion experience in November
Teaching	Precepting students and PGY1 residents, optional experiences at High Point University facilitating discussions and labs, ACPE lecture	August - June	Continuing education lecture in October to pharmacy staff. Topics will be provided in orientation and vetted through our EBM/CE organizers. Resident will be provided with a presentation date and time well in advance.
